Seventh-day Adventist Philosophy

We recognize, principally, God as the only source of existence, strength, and truth. In the beginning, God created in His image a perfect humanity - a perfection later marred by sin. Through Jesus Christ and His Holy Spirit, God determined to rescue humanity from its lost state. Through the Bible, He has revealed His will to the world - a revelation that supersedes human reason. Through His Church on earth, He seeks the missing of His Kingdom.

Secondly, Seventh-day Adventist education is deliberate in providing a Christ-centered curriculum. The policies, standards, and guidelines for even distance learning education courses support this premise. Distance education courses actively engage students in a manner that strengthens their relationship with Christ.

Adventist online and distance education, thirdly, is student-focused and utilizes principles of best practice. Students are engaged in active learning enabled by instructors who select a variety of appropriate teaching strategies, modes, media, and assessment.

World-Wide Educational Institution

Though primary education for children was advocated by Adventists during the 1850s and 1860s, it was not until the early 1870s that the newly budding Adventist Church began to recognize and develop a denominationally based school system.



The Saipan Seventh-day Adventist School is a non-profit organization, owned and operated by the Seventh-day Adventist Church, under the direction of the Guam-Micronesia Mission of Seventh-day Adventists. As of 2021-2022, the overall SDA Church Organization operates over 8,800 schools worldwide, with an estimated enrollment of 1.8 million students in preschool through university levels.

Campus Locations

Saipan SDA School operates both the Child Development Center and the Elementary School in Chalan Kiya. It is located behind the Mobil gas station. The Child Development Center is for ages 18 months through age four. The Elementary School (K-8) includes classrooms for kindergarten thru eighth grade.

Admission Procedures

Admission to the SDA Kindergarten through 8th grade campus is open to all students, regardless of ethnic background/origin or religious beliefs. An application is required, and placement is based on age and prior academic work. Applications must be submitted and approved each year for student to attend the SDA School

This fee will be communicated by the homeroom teachers and payment required during the second semester of the school year.

Book Replacement/Damage Fee:

All textbooks issued to students are assessed at the beginning and end of the year. If a book is lost or returned with unnecessary or excessive damage, then the student will be charged a damage or replacement fee for the textbook. Students are responsible for their books.

LEGO Robotics/Intramural Sports Fee:

To be announced by the activity director or sponsor.

Field Trip Fees:

Will be announced by classroom teachers.

Late Pick-up Fee:

Regular pick-up time is from 3:00-3:15 p.m. Monday through Thursday and from 12:30-12:45 p.m. on Friday. After school care pick-up is until 4:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 4:00 p.m. A 15-minute grace period is given for extenuating circumstances. After this time a \$1 per minute fee is assessed when your child is not picked-up before this time.



Financial Requirements

Full monthly payment is due on the last day of every month. Once an account becomes more than 15 days late, a 3% late fee will be assessed each month. Any student account that is not paid in full by the end of every month will be considered delinquent and will enter the following 3-Step Financial Delinquency Status:

- Step 1 – A letter of reminder will be sent to parents/guardians and/or to the individual responsible for finances, requiring payment to be made within 5 working days.
- Step 2 – Students can be suspended from attending any school activity until payment is made. A letter of suspension will be sent. Person(s) responsible for finances must make payment to the SDA accountant.
- Step 3 – If an account remains delinquent and financial arrangements are not made within 45 days, then the student is withdrawn, and the account may be sent to a collection agency.

If an account is identified as delinquent, no school records may be released until payment is made in FULL.

Other Financial Information

Tuition is a yearly fee divided into monthly payments.

1. Tuition payments will NOT be prorated. Tuition is calculated by the month. There is no refund for a student who withdraws or misses school; for days cancelled due to inclement weather such as typhoons, storms; or for any other reason during the middle or any time of the month. There are no refunds for missed days of school.
2. Payment Methods:
 - Cash
 - Check – made payable to Saipan SDA School
 - Credit Cards – Visa, MasterCard
 - Payroll Allotment



3. Returned Checks – A fee of \$30.00 will be charged for all returned checks; and a cash repayment must be made immediately in this case.
4. Discounts Available:
 - Multiple Student Discount – For students in the same immediate family a discount is given
 - 2nd Child – 10% discount
 - 3rd Child – 15% discount
 - 4th Child – 20% discount
 - Advance Payment Discount –
 - Pre-Payment for entire semester – 5% discount on tuition fees
 - Pre-Payment for entire school year – 10% discount on tuition fees

Withdrawal Procedure

Any parent wishing to transfer or withdraw their child from the SDA School should do the following:

1. Fill out the withdrawal form in the office at least five days before the last day of attendance.
2. All financial obligations must be paid in full.
3. Fill out a transcript request form for permanent records to be sent to a new school if necessary. Transcript requests may take 5 – 7 working days to be fulfilled.

Tuition payments will not be prorated for students who are withdrawing. The above procedures will assist the teacher and administration in order to help the child with the transition process, making it as smooth as possible.



Positive Behavioral Acts

1. Respect Others – An attitude of care, appreciation, and respect should be given to peers, staff members, and anyone on the campus of the SDA School or off-campus during any school sponsored event.
2. Be Involved & Strive High – Students are expected to actively participate in all school activities, doing their best always.
3. Be Prepared – Students are expected to be prepared in the following areas:
 - Come to school on time every day.
 - Complete all homework on time.
 - Manage study time at home and school to be prepared for class activities.
 - Have school supplies at school each day.
 - Wear school uniform at all times.
4. Ask for Help – Students are expected to request assistance when needed from teachers, staff, and parents.
5. **Understand & Follow Classroom Procedures** – All teachers will have detailed procedures and expectations to be followed. Each student is expected to understand, respect, and follow the procedures for his/her various classes, this includes distancing.
6. Language Habits – All students who have ELL status and in the process of learning English are always expected to speak and write English. **Using other languages besides English is not allowed**, as this will slow the English learning process. Teachers will help ELL students in this process and work with each student on an individual basis.
7. Reach Out – Students are expected to reach out beyond themselves, looking out for others - including peers and staff. Students are expected



to appreciate opportunities for making the Saipan SDA School and the island of Saipan a better place. Students will actively participate in community service projects throughout the school year.

Negative Student Behavior(s) to Avoid

The following behavior(s) will NOT be tolerated from any student attending the Saipan SDA School:

1. Bullying in any form – Students may not engage in verbal, physical, or sexual abuse of other students or staff. Students MUST always show respect to others. Fighting is prohibited.
2. Using swear/curse words or rough language.
3. Possession and/or use of Stimulants; students may NOT bring any kind of stimulant to school including but not limited to the following:
 - Alcohol
 - Cigarettes
 - Marijuana
 - Betel nut
 - Tobacco
 - Any other illegal drugs or medication
4. Possession and/or use of Weapons – Students may not bring or use weapons of any kind at school, including but not limited to, the following:
 - Knives
 - Guns
 - Explosive devices
5. Stealing – Students may not take anything from another student, staff member, or object that is not their own property.
6. Cheating & Plagiarism – Students may not cheat on tests, quizzes, or daily work. Plagiarism for research projects or other assignments is not allowed.



7. Property Damage – Damage or destruction that a student causes to objects belonging to another student will be replaced by the offending student. Items that are property of the school will be charged to that student's account.
8. Leaving School Premises – Students are not allowed to leave the school campus or any area (field trip location) in which school activities are being held. Students must always remain with their assigned teacher or supervisor.
9. Defiance – Students are not permitted to show negative attitudes or acts of defiance toward any teacher or staff member.
10. Breaking the Line of Communication Between Staff & Parents – Students are not allowed to divert communication between staff members and parents in any way, such as throwing away letters to parents, diverting phone calls, or forging parent signatures on progress reports or other forms.

Student Expectations

Students enrolled in the SDA School should conduct themselves in the following ways to ensure the safety of themselves and each of the other students and staff.

8. Respect Others – An attitude of care, appreciation, and respect should be given to peers, staff members, and anyone on the campus of the SDA School or off-campus during any school sponsored event.
9. Be Involved & Strive High – Students are expected to actively participate in all school activities, always doing their best.
10. Be Prepared – Students are expected to be prepared in the following areas:
 - Come to school on time every day. Classes begin at 8:00 a.m. Students who arrive after 8:00 a.m. are late.
 - Complete all homework on time.



- Manage study time at home and school to be prepared for class activities.
 - Have school supplies at school each day.
 - Wear school uniform always.
11. Ask for Help – Students are expected to request assistance when needed from teachers, staff and parents.
 12. Understand & Follow Classroom Procedures – All teachers will have detailed procedures and expectations to follow. Each student is expected to understand, respect, and follow the procedures for his/her various classes.
 13. Language Habits – All students who are ESL status and in the process of learning English are always expected to speak and write English. Using other languages besides English is not allowed, as this will slow the English learning process. Teachers will help ESL students in this process and work with each student on an individual basis.
 14. Reach Out – Students are expected to reach out beyond themselves, looking out for others - including peers and staff. Students are expected to appreciate opportunities for making the SDA School and the island of Saipan a better place. Students will actively participate in community service projects throughout the school year.

Negative Student Behavior(s) to Avoid

The following behavior(s) will NOT be tolerated from any student at the SDA School:

Other Items That Should NOT Be Brought to School

The following items will not be brought to school and will be confiscated if found at school. The following list includes but is not limited to:

- CD Players/Radios, Headsets, iPod, MP3 Players, iPad,
- Inappropriate Literature



- Personal electronic devices; cellphones, iPads, tablets, laptops, etc.
- Toys or Games
- Skateboards/Longboards
- Any item that may interfere with learning

Consequences of Negative Student Behavior

Students will be treated individually and with respect, courtesy, and love when being disciplined. The following behavioral consequences may be issued, to prevent the occurrence of negative student behavior(s):

Classroom Management Plan – Each teacher maintains a plan of action for negative student behavior(s). Students will receive this first course of action, if needed, which may include immediate, in-class consequences. This plan will be communicated by the classroom teacher to students and parents at the beginning of the school year.

1. After-School Detention – Students being disciplined by their teacher for any negative behavior(s), may be asked to serve one period of detention (30 minutes after school). Teachers will send a “Detention Form” home with the student the day before the scheduled detention is to be served, to notify parent(s)/guardian(s). All detentions will be documented and put in the student’s file.
2. A Parent/Guardian/Teacher Conference will be scheduled for students who have served 3 after-school detentions for continued negative behavior(s), to discuss a behavior improvement plan for the student.
3. Students who persist in negative behavior(s), after implementation of a behavior improvement plan, will be required to attend a Parent (/Guardian/Teacher/Principal Conference. The student may receive 1 full day suspension from school and any school activities. Academic work that is missed cannot be made up. Length of suspension will be determined on a case-by-case basis.
4. Probation – Students may return to school following a suspension, on a probationary status. They will be monitored to ensure that the negative behavior does not repeat, or any other negative behavior(s) occur.



5. Expulsion – If a student continues to exhibit negative behavior upon their return from a suspension, his/her name will be taken to the school board to discuss possible student dismissal from enrollment at Saipan SDA School for the remainder of the school year.

Parents may be contacted at any point, as deemed necessary, regarding a student's negative behavior(s). Any consequence may be given, according to the severity of the issue.

Student Recognition

1. Classroom Rewards – Each teacher will implement class-wide and individual programs to recognize positive student behavior. Notes of appreciation may be sent home to show parent/guardian.
2. Student of the Month Award – Students who show outstanding achievements in the areas of spiritual, academic, social, and physical areas of school life may be nominated by their teacher for this award.
3. Academic Awards – The SDA School believes in the value of recognizing academic achievement. Students will be recognized each quarter for the following scholastic grade achievements:
 - Principal's List – Student who earns all A's with an average of 92% - 100% = A. For a student to be on the principals list they must earn all A's on their report card. Likewise, their conduct must be "E" – Excellent.
 - Honor Roll List – Students who make A's and B's with an average of 88% - 91% = B+ to A-. Likewise, their conduct must be excellent or satisfactory.



Parent/Guardian Expectations

“Parent Volunteer Discount” – The staff of the Saipan SDA School share the belief that parents, and teachers are team-players in educating children. Because of this, parents are encouraged to be involved in the school in as many ways as possible. The school encourages each family to donate 50 hours of volunteer service to the school each year in classrooms or for school activities. A log sheet will be kept by each homeroom teacher for logging these hours. During the month of May, any family who has completed 50 hours will receive a \$100 tuition discount on their May billing. One discount applies per family. Below are accumulative ways parents can be involved:

1. Classroom Assistance – Helping teachers with any task in the classroom such as setting up bulletin boards, preparing materials, etc.
2. Field Trips – Driving for and/or helping supervise during field trips or other school activities.
3. Reading Aloud – Read to or with students during class.
4. Religious Life Activities, meaning actively participate in church related activities such as: worship services, Christian gospel programs, community service work, etc.
5. Outdoor School – Join an Outdoor School Planning Committee – Committee hours will be logged.
6. Sharing a Career or Hobby – Making a class presentation or allowing a field trip to your place of work to share your career/hobby with students, and helping staff plan for and/or implement school events are all ways to earn 50 hours of volunteer service.



Parents are strongly encouraged to do the following on a regular basis:

- Make sure your child arrives at school and is picked up after school on time.
- Check progress reports that are sent home – discuss strong/weak areas with your child – sign progress report and have child take back to homeroom teacher when due.
- Provide assistance with homework and preparation for tests.
- Read and understand all correspondence sent home from the administration and teachers.
- Attend the Parent Teacher Conference meetings twice a year – which occur after the 1st and 3rd quarters of the year.
- Communicate classroom concerns with the classroom teacher directly. Bring issues to the principal, after discussing them first with the homeroom teacher, only if concern is not resolved.
- Support classroom teacher(s) and school programs.

Communication with Parents

It is vitally important for the student's success that the SDA School staff and parents stay in regular communication. The following communication(s) will be made by the SDA Staff in order to reach out to the parent(s)/guardian(s) including the following:

- Friday letter from the principal.
- Progress reports are now available online:

- Access instructions for JUPITER ED, available at the main office.
- Regular letters of events coming up and important information to be sent home by the teacher.
- Any or all these methods can be sent to the parent via email, if requested and indicated on the "Communication Sheet" during registration day.



In addition, parents are welcome to contact teachers at school, or to request a conference with teacher after school hours. Parents are welcome to call or stop by to see the principal or leave messages with the office of administration.

Attendance

Attendance is very important for all grades. This is part of the educational process and should be a high priority. A student may not be absent from school for any reason for more than 4 unexcused absences during a 9-week (quarter) grading period. Absences exceeding this amount may require the student to repeat a portion or all that class or school year.

Tardy – The Saipan Seventh-day Adventist School day begins at 8:00 a.m. One of the most valuable life skills a student can learn is taking the responsibility of arriving at school every day on time. This skill can easily be accomplished and will transfer as a valuable asset for the future. One of the most important times of the school day is the morning. This is the time when important school news is announced, teachers give an overview of plans for the day, and instructional goals are reviewed and/or set. The whole tone of a child's school day is set in the first part of the day. Please help support your child's development in learning habits that will help them be successful at school and throughout life. If a student arrives to school after 8:00 a.m., that student is considered tardy. Three tardiness within a quarter grading period is considered equal to 1 day and is recorded as an unexcused absence for that student. If your child arrives after 8:00 a.m., the parent/guardian and student must come to the office in order to sign their child in and the student to receive a tardy pass. Students who are tardy will not be allowed to enter their classroom without a pass. Excessive tardiness, (12) within one quarter grading period, may be grounds for student dismissal from school. The parent(s)/guardian(s) would then be required to re-register their child and pay the registration fee, for their child to continue attending classes at Saipan SDA School, subject to school board approval.

Excused Absences – Absences may be excused due to illness, medical or dental appointments, family funerals, rosaries and approved, prearranged family trips (at least one-week notice).



Any other absence must be requested in writing to the principal and is subject to approval. Excused absences allow the student to make up any missing work. Students are not allowed to make up any class-work due to unexcused absences.

Early Pick-Up – When parents or guardians find it necessary to pick up students before the end of the school day, because of schedule changes that cannot be avoided, the parent/guardian may call the school office to notify the teacher. This enables the student to be ready for pick-up in the office. Parent(s)/guardian(s) are required to come to the office in order to sign their child out.

Daily School Schedule

School Beginning time and Ending:

8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday, and Friday
8:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

Daily Drop-Off – Students should be dropped off in front of the school office. They are to wait on the benches on the first floor until their teacher arrives to escort them to class. Students may arrive at school as early as 7:00 a.m., providing a SDA school staff member is present. The school is not held accountable for any student dropped off before 7:00 a.m.

Daily Pick-Up – Students should be picked up between 3:00 – 3:15 p.m., Monday – Thursday, and between 12:30 – 12:45 p.m. on Friday. The classroom teacher will note who has picked up each child and the time of their departure, based on the information given in the “Transportation Home” form. If someone other than the individual(s) listed on this form will be picking up a student, the parent/guardian must send a note or phone call ahead of time, granting permission for that individual to pick up their child. This individual must come into the office to sign a dismissal sheet, when a pick-up occurs for this situation,

After School Academy – students may be picked up between 4:00 – 4:15 p.m.



School Uniform

Students are always to wear the school uniform as listed in this handbook. If there is a reason why a student cannot wear the uniform on any given day, a note from the parent must be written to provide explanation, or the student will receive an office referral and the parent(s)/guardian(s) may be contacted.

The school uniform is a forest (spruce) green polo shirt and choice of khaki bottoms. The polo shirt may be purchased from the SDA School Office. The bottoms vary for female and male students as listed below:

Female Students:

- Shirt – Forest green polo shirt with school name
- Bottom:
 - Skorts
 - Capri-Style pants
 - Knee length shorts may be worn during P. E. class.

Shoes for both females and males should be closed toe shoes suitable for school activities.





P. E.:

Students should wear school uniform shirts or specified P.E. t-shirts during their P.E. class.

Hats, head bandanas, or caps of any type are not to be worn in any part of the building, except on special approved events such as: School Spirit Week, Cultural Awareness Days, etc.

Jewelry – Neat and attractive clothing promote a good self-image and a better environment for learning. Therefore, students are encouraged to dress in harmony with the basic principles of health, modesty and appropriateness. The following will not be worn at school:

1. Jewelry: bracelets, non-medical I.D. bracelets, rings, earrings and necklaces.
2. Extreme styles or coloring of hair.
3. Heavy make-up
4. Immodest hemlines (above the knees)
5. Sheer, low-cut sleeveless, tight fitting or frayed clothing.
6. Students are not to wear lipstick, long false nails, colored nail polish, rouge, eye shadow, mascara or such items to school.





Academics

The academic success of each student is very important to every teacher and staff member of the SDA School. Because of the small family atmosphere, the teachers can reach out in many ways to help individual students. The Saipan SDA School uses curriculum that has been developed by The Education Department of the North American Division of Seventh-day Adventists. All textbooks used are from United States publishing companies. Instruction is in English for all classes.

Student Portfolio – The teachers maintain a file for each student containing academic work, to observe, study, and determine academic patterns.

Homework Policy – Classroom teachers will establish the schedule for giving homework and will follow established grading weights for homework assignments.

Electronic Policy – Personal electronics devices are not allowed at school.

First offense, electronic device is held in the office for one day and the parent is called. Second offense, electronic device is held for 72 hours, afterwards, may only be picked up by parent. Third offense, electronic device is kept until the end of the school year term.

Academic Assistance

The SDA School upholds high academic standards in order to help students achieve success. Students are not allowed to have a grade of “F” in any class beyond three consecutive weeks. If a failing grade is not brought up, the following steps are recommended:

1. Conference with parents, student, and teacher to develop an academic action plan, which is to be approved by the principal. Results must then be seen within four weeks of implementation.
2. Academic Probation – If the four-week plan of action shows no positive results, the student will be placed on academic probation and will not be allowed to participate in intramural sports. This requires that the parents find a private tutor to help the student improve their study habits and academic skills.
3. Students, who after going through the above two processes still with a grade of “D” or below in a core subject, will be placed on probation through the next quarter. If the student continues to acquire “D” or below the matter may be sent to the school board for other actions or recommendations to the parents of the student.

Community Service

The SDA School seeks to teach students to reach out to others and contribute to their community. “Community Service Days” are scheduled throughout the year as listed on the school calendar, as well as service projects initiated through Bible, Science, Math, Music/Arts, Language Arts, and Physical Education class curriculum.

8th Grade Graduation Requirements

Academic Requirements – All students in 8th grade must maintain a C- average in the core classes of Math, Science, History, Reading, and Language and should be reading on the 8th grade level, in order to graduate and be promoted to the 9th grade. Students with a grade below a C- will be required to



re-take the class to earn the required higher grade. Options and/or provisions for making up any class must be discussed with the Saipan SDA School Principal.

Financial Requirement – Students in 8th grade must have a cleared financial balance, before being allowed to participate in the graduation ceremonies and/or in order to receive their diploma or transcript.

Class Ownership – The 8th grade class will choose various symbols; class colors; and a class aim and motto to represent their class. These will be used throughout the year and at the graduation ceremony. The class will also elect class officers in September to help lead out in special class activities throughout the year.

8th Grade Class Valedictorian & Salutatorian – The student with the highest-grade point average of all classes taken during the 8th grade year at Saipan SDA School will receive the honor of class valedictorian. The student with the 2nd highest grade point average will receive the salutatorian award. A minimum of an 87.5% over-all grade point average is required to receive the Valedictorian or Salutatorian award.

Extracurricular Activities

The Saipan SDA School believes in a holistic development approach for their students and being involved in the community. To enable our students to interact with other schools, the SDA School participates in the Private School Intramural Sports League. The following extracurricular activities are provided to the students to promote the spiritual, academic, social and physical development.

* Intramural Sports – Volleyball, Track and Field, Basketball, Softball, and soccer ball are Intramural sports are offered for 3rd – 8th grade. There are some accommodations for grades K – 2 as kept in compliance with the NAD Athletic Curriculum Standards Program.



* Student Association – grades 5th – 8th

(Note: You must have been a student at the SDA School for at least one year and entering the second year, before one can run for an office)

**There is a fee for some of the extracurricular activities listed above, to be communicated at the beginning of the year or season by the activity director/sponsor of activity.

**Students must maintain “C” or 2.50 GPA average in all classes, to be eligible to participate in these activities.



Religious Life Activities

On / Off-Island Trips

8th Grade Class Trip – The 8th grade class has the option to take an off-island class trip during Spring Break. This trip is fully fundraised by the class. The trip combines educational fun with valuable educational experiences. Before the trip, the 8th grade teacher creates a unit plan showing the curriculum items to be covered throughout the travel experience. The rest of the students in grades Kindergarten through 7th grade will briefly study the country the 8th graders will travel to, prior to the trip as well. The trip is accompanied and led by the 8th grade homeroom teacher/sponsor, in addition to 1 – 2 other staff sponsor(s).





Other Important Information

Food Service – Students may bring their own food to school or purchase the meals provided through the Public-School System. Meals can be ordered and purchased by the month.

Medication – The SDA School staff cannot administer any medication to students unless the parent(s)/guardian(s) requests such assistance in writing and a doctor provides written instructions. Parent(s)/guardian(s) should submit a note, along with any medications, to the Saipan SDA School office for each day their child will need to take medication during school hours. Parents can come to the school to administer any medication to their child throughout the day, as they may deem necessary.

Visitors – For the safety of the students, all visitors (parents, guardians, all others) are required to check in at the office before entering any classroom, playground, or other areas of the Saipan SDA School Campus.

Games/Toys/Skateboard/Long-boards – Please do not allow your child to bring a skateboard, long-board, games and/or toys on campus. These items tend to distract from the education of the student(s). For the safety of each student, we ask that they do not bring these items on campus.
